Moses, the Man of God Preaching in India

This is a wonderfully telling photo of the ministry of one man of God—Evangelist Moses. Brother Moses is carrying the Gospel to an area that has over 150 small villages. Here he is preaching to people in Sahimabad village. The name “Sahimabad” indicates that there is very strong Islamic influence in this place.

Notice that the men are sitting out under the sky, while the women (far left) are under the protection of the porch. As darkness falls, the men will be between the women and the darkness. Notice also how intensely the people are listening to Brother Moses, bringing the Light of God’s Word.

I know, from personal interviews with Brother Moses, that he has faced many dangers. He is constantly being threatened, and he has been stoned and ran out of town many times.

He is quiet and respectful in every way. But he is valiant for the Word of God. And he is definitely a faith walker. Please pray for Brother Moses.
